The Jackson Hole Community Housing Trust welcomes three new board members

Jackson, WY—The Jackson Hole Community Housing Trust is pleased to announce the appointment of Van Davis, Deborah Ramo, and Ethan Steinberg to the Housing Trust board of directors.

“We are thrilled to welcome Van, Deborah, and Ethan to the board. They bring professional and civic experience to the organization and are uniquely passionate about the role of affordable housing in our community,” said Board Chair Berte Hirschfield.

Deborah Ramo first visited Jackson in 1984 and it left an indelible impression on her.

“Having grown up in Hawaii and spending much of my career in Los Angeles, I’ve seen first-hand how the lack of affordable housing for essential workers can impact entire families and communities. I’m honored to join the Housing Trust’s efforts to move our Jackson Hole community forward and cultivate a vital future for all,” said Ramo.

Deborah has an expansive career as a communication executive in the entertainment industry. In 2001 she founded a strategic communications firm with international engagements that included leading the efforts to advance **Democracy is...** a campaign that included the participation of 132 countries and the US Department of State, International Youth Foundation, NBC Universal, and YouTube. Deborah is a Senior Fellow at the Brittingham Social Enterprise Lab at USC Marshall School of Business.

Van Davis has lived in Teton County for 7 years. Prior to joining the Housing Trust, he served for 12 years on the board of Princeton Community Housing. Van is retired from a career in law; a substantial portion of his practice involved the financing of affordable housing.

Ethan Steinberg moved to Jackson in 1996 where he spent 16 years helping to manage the Brandywine Funds.

In 2013, Ethan launched his own investment fund partnership with SG Capital which he still runs today. In addition to his work in finance, Ethan was a founding board member of the Jackson Hole Community School. He currently serves on the Resource Council of the Grand Teton National Park Foundation.

The Jackson Hole Community Housing Trust is a non-profit affordable housing developer. To date, the Housing Trust has developed or acquired 157 homes which have served more than 420 community members. This fall, the Trust will complete construction of 24 more affordable homes at 174 North King Street.
